Well we've almost reached the end of term and what a funpacked term it has been! Our topic work has proved very popular and all the classes have embraced their learning with interest and enthusiasm.

The launch of Class Dojo has enabled the teachers to share more of the learning taking place in school with parents and carers.

Inspired by our topic - 'Lights, Camera, Action', Year 3 and 4 have worked hard to produce some fantastic Harry Potter inspired play scripts and performance poetry as part of their English work.

The children have also had great opportunities to research, design and make pan pipes and string telephones when exploring sound in science. In other topics the children studied Divali in RE and photography as part of their computing work.

The Year 5 children have been learning about how the ear works. They have been using plasticine to design and make characters inspired by Wallace and Gromit, ready to create a short film.

Year 6 have really enjoyed studying the book 'Coraline', creating shoe box film sets based on different scenes from the book. They have used it as inspiration to write their own stories too.

In science, the children have been investigating the properties of different materials. As part of this work they made their own quick sand!

Harry Potter Studio Tour

The children enjoyed our trip to the Harry Potter Studio Tour on 24th November, where they were able to walk in the footsteps of Harry Potter and explore the wonders of the wizarding world!

Throughout the day pupils wandered wide-eyed around

some of the amazing sets including the Great Hall, Platform 9 ³/₄ and Diagon Alley. The Great Hall served as the backdrop to some of the film series' most iconic scenes



such as the Yule Ball and the Battle of Hogwarts! It was laid out with a Christmas banquet, complete with flaming Christmas puddings!



The children appreciated exploring the collection of beautifully crafted props and original costumes, but they were especially keen to learn about the special and visual effects used when film making. All the children were surprised to learn that film makers often shoot

visual effects on a green screen then create a computer generated set! They were thrilled to have their photo taken in front of one! A fantastic memento of their day.





The tour concluded with the jewel in the crown of the art department, a detailed model of Hogwarts Castle! A team of 86 artists and crew members built the first version for Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone.

The children were thrilled that it was covered in a fine layer of snow! It heightened the magical atmosphere that filled the room and left the children with a lasting image in their minds.
