Our Learning

Year 3 - Oystercatcher

Year 3 have settled really well into their new school and have been working incredibly hard! We have been looking at the composition of numbers and have moved onto addition and subtraction and practised exchanging between different place value columns. We are continuing to work on our times tables and any practise you can do at home will help the children enormously. We are working on 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10 tables. In English we have written warning tales based on Icarus and are now working on persuasive adverts. In history we have been learning about the ancient Greeks and have learnt some amazing facts about the Spartans. In geography we have learnt all about compasses and grid references and I've discovered we have some very talented artists after looking at the children's amazing art work. We also have some very talented sports people - perhaps there are some future England cricketers in Oystercatchers!











Year 4 - Avocet

Avocets have had a great first half term. We have been to an amazing Olympic sports festival at Smithdon High school taking part in various sports. The children loved it and we will hopefully get to go again in the Summer term. In Geography, we have been exploring our local area and developing our map skills such as finding the scale and working out the distance between two places. On the other hand, our RE lessons were learning about Buddhism and as a class we have created a happiness mobile that represents Right Speech, Right thought and Right action, which are parts of the Eightfold path. The last picture shows how excited and passionate Avocets were about our new English unit as our high quality text is Dr Ernest Drake's Dragonology- such a great interactive book! In this lesson, they had to activate their prior knowledge and they thought of some great connections linked to a picture of a creature's eye and wrote such detailed descriptions of what they thought the creature would look like- I was so impressed. Super efforts this term Avocets, keep it up! Looking forward to next term learning about The rise and fall of Ancient Rome in History and Mediterranean Europe in Geography- we even get to try some of their cuisine!









Our Learning (cont'd)

Year 5 - Albatross

We've had a very busy first half term in Albatross Class learning about some fascinating topics in all of our foundation subjects. In history we've been learning about the Islamic Golden Age and the creation of the progressive 'City of Peace' Baghdad in 900 CE where people would travel all over the world to learn, study and share ideas. In RE the children now have a great understanding of the importance of Muhammud to Muslims and why the Muslim holy book the Qu'ran is so precious to all followers of Islam. These have linked perfectly with our Art where we've learnt about the intricate nature of Islamic Architecture. The children have designed and created their own clay tiles influenced by the patterns in the architecture we've been studying. We've also conducted some super science experiments in class measuring our lung capacity and making blood using marshmallows and cheerios to represent white blood cells and platelets!! We have packed in so much this half term also enjoying a fantastic day out at Smithdon High School for the KS2 Olympic event where the children got to experience lots of different sporting opportunities and we've also supported the 'Young Minds' charity by all wearing yellow and discussing the importance of looking after our mental health. The children have consistently demonstrated excellent learning behaviours and we're so proud of them for all their hard work during this first half term. We can't wait to see what exciting things we'll get up to next half term!











<u>Year 6 – Royal Tern</u>

This half term in English we have been studying the book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan which is a beautiful and very moving book with no words. It follows the story of a man who is an immigrant and how he builds a new life for himself and his family. Royal Terns wrote amazing poetry using this book and our 'hot writes' were a meeting tale. In History, we have been learning about World War One and the consequences of the war. They have learnt all about the periodic table in Science! In Art, we enjoyed learning about William Morris and 'decorative arts'. Children designed and printed their own wallpaper. PE has also been thoroughly enjoyable this half term; learning to play rounders and developing fitness in cross-country. The children were excellent at working together to create their own cross-country course which they then took it in turns to try with the class.


Children are invited to wear something Yellow, Spotty, Stripy or Bear-themed into school. Clothes must be suitable for the cold, wet weather.



Ingredients

225g plain flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tbsp ground cinnamon (or 2 tsp pumpkin spice)

100g caster sugar

50g soft light brown sugar

200g pumpkin purée (from a can or homemade – see 'goes well with' below)

2 large eggs

125g slightly salted butter, melted

PUMPKIN MUFFINS

Method

STEP 1

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with muffin cases. Mix the flour, baking powder, cinnamon and both sugars together in a large bowl. Break up any lumps of brown sugar by rubbing them between your fingers.

STEP 2

Whisk the purée and eggs together in a jug, then add to the dry ingredients with the melted butter. Whisk for 1-2 mins with an electric hand whisk until just combined.

STEP 3

Bake for 15 mins until golden and risen and a skewer inserted comes out clean. Lift onto a wire rack to cool completely. Will keep for three days in an airtight container.
