

Newsletter ~ October 2017 Heacham Junior School




What a great start to the academic year! Firstly, we would like to wish a warm welcome to all our new parents, pupils and staff. Our new Year 3 children have settled and adapted very well to the routines of school life at Heacham Junior School.

The children have embraced their topic 'Lights, Camera, Action' and are eagerly anticipating their trip to Harry Potter World later this term.

The children in Year 3/4 have been busy completing Mission 1 of the Big Writing Adventures ~ 'Superheroes'. This has involved inventing some dazzling super heroes to write about! In mathematics they have been exploring written methods for addition and subtraction, as well as further developing their

problem solving and reasoning skills during number sense sessions in the afternoons.



Our topic has meant that the children have got creative designing Harry Potter movie posters using printing techniques. In RE the children have been learning and retelling the story of Rama and Sita. They have also decorated rangoli patterns and have moulded and shaped clay to create their own diva lamps which are associated with Divali.

In science they have been learning about light and electricity. The children have explored light, reflections and shadows, identifying sources of light and recognising how shadows change size throughout the day.





Classes S5 and B5/6 have been busy completing Mission 1 of the Big Writing Adventures ~ 'Animals in Danger'. This has led to them writing reports about some of our planet's most endangered species including rhinos and orangutans. This unit will conclude with the children creating their own radio broadcasts! The Year 6 children have been researching the life of Charlie Chaplin, producing some well written biographies. They have also been exploring the features of, and writing, play scripts.

The children have been working on place value, securing their understanding of the four operations and investigating the properties of different shapes in mathematics. In addition to this, they have been consolidating their times tables knowledge as this is such an integral part of their work.

In science the children have been learning about light, sound and electricity. They have been getting 'hands on' creating circuits, learning to represent them using symbols and diagrams. In sound, the children have attempted to create instruments which make no noise at all!
