We even had a surprise visit from Pudsey himself – what a treat!

### **Our Learning**

### Year 3 - Oystercatcher

We have had a very exciting half term so far with several trips and visits which have enriched our learning. We had an amazing trip to Wild Ken Hill where we learnt about different farming processes and crops, we completed a bug hunt, learnt about the importance of trees and most importantly we had fun! On children in need day we did some Pudsey bear activities and the children were delighted when the famous bear himself popped into our class! Our third exciting visitor allowed us to step back in time to ancient Greece. The children (and Mrs Feeney) dressed in Greek costumes and took part in a range of activities including story-telling, drama, maths puzzles and even an Olympic games! This workshop really brought our history learning to life. Back in the classroom, the children have been learning to multiply and divide and are now concentrating on learning their 3, 4, 6 and 8 times tables and finding patterns between them. In English, we have been writing wishing tales, learning about Western Europe in geography, the true meaning of Christmas in RE and investigating the water cycle in science.













### Year 4 - Avocet

Avocets have shown great efforts in all subjects this term leading up to Christmas. They loved the Norwich Castle trip learning about the Romans and Iceni life. We got to experience shield formations (tortoise) as soldiers, touch Roman objects and act out jobs that the Iceni would accomplish each day. We have also learnt about Mediterranean Europe in Geography, alongside Ancient Rome in History. The children tried various Mediterranean food like olives, oranges, feta cheese, apricots and tomatoes. Great to see them trying different food to what they're used to!

### **Our Learning** (cont'd)

### Year 5 - Albatross

We've gone full throttle into the second half of our Autumn term in Albatross Class and the children have been working so hard throughout producing some wonderful pieces of work. We've covered a lot of the globe with our foundation subjects, studying African art and the importance of ceremonial headdresses in some parts of African culture. We've studied lots of mountain ranges in Asia, Europe and South America perhaps you could ask your Albatross what facts they can tell you about Mount Everest or where the ancient mummified body of Otzi was discovered and how old he was? In history we've also looked at how far the British Empire spread across the globe and how we gained so much power and control to enable us to become so hugely successful. In science, our minds have been tested as we've studied how small an atom is creating our own oxygen atoms with protons, neutrons and electrons. Finally, as we head towards the festive season our RE lessons have linked in nicely as we've revisited the Christmas story and investigated varying details in the gospels of Matthew and Luke. The children also very much enjoyed their trip to a Mosque in Peterborough to support their RE learning on Islam and the importance of the Qu'ran from last term. As always we're so proud of the Albatrosses for all their continued hard work throughout the whole of this half term and we're excited for some festive fun during the final few weeks before they can enjoy a well earned rest over Christmas









### Year 6 - Royal Tern

We have had another busy half term in Royal Terns! We have been working on fractions in Maths and persevering when adding, subtracting, ordering and comparing fractions! In English, we finished our Suffragette biography work and have since been studying discursive texts using the novel 'Stay Where You Are and Then Leave.' We have been learning all about Suffragettes in History; the NUWSS and the WSPU. We struggled to decide if we would have been pacifists or militant activists in the battle for equality! The children have really enjoyed art this term. We have been looking at the Renaissance and have studied artists like Michelangelo and Leonardo di Vinci. We sketched our eyes, drew landscapes using perspective and created sun discs which we will paint before Christmas. We enjoyed Children in Need day, Parliament week and we are now looking forward to Christmas! We have our trip to the Sainsbury Centre in the last week before the term ends too!

### **HEACHAM SCHOOL LOTTERY**



### 🙀 MERRY CHRISTMAS 🍂

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### Ingredients

100g butter, cut into cubes, plus extra for the tin

250g Christmas biscuits, such as shortbread or chocolate biscuits

75g shelled nuts (use up a bag of whole nuts, or bits and bobs from the baking cupboard)

100g mixed dried fruit (such as raisins, cherries or glacé ginger)

75g Christmas sweets (candy canes, marshmallows or jelly sweets)

400g milk or plain chocolate (or a mixture of both), chopped

140g golden syrup (weigh this straight into the pan you will use for melting)

2 tbsp sprinkles , or more sweets, to decorate

### **Christmas Rocky Road**

### Method

### STEP 1

Butter and line a 20cm square tin, or use a 20cm square silicone mould. Break the biscuits into pieces – they need to be no smaller than a pea, but not too chunky or your rocky road won't hold together.

### STEP 2

Halve any larger nuts either by snapping them or carefully cutting with a knife, then combine them with the biscuits. Halve any large pieces of dried fruit and chop or snap sweets into smaller pieces, then add these to the bowl.

### STEP 3

Melt 300g of the chocolate, the butter and the golden syrup carefully in a pan set over a low heat, stirring occasionally, then pour this over the biscuit and nut mixture and mix together so the chocolate covers everything.

### STEP 4

Tip the mixture into the tin, then level the top – it doesn't need to be completely smooth. Melt the remaining chocolate in the microwave in short blasts, or in a heatproof bowl over a small pan of simmering water, then drizzle this over the top and sprinkle with the decorations. Chill for at least 3 hrs or overnight before cutting into squares. Will keep in the fridge for three to four days.
