Dear Parents and Carers,

This half-term has been busy, filled with great learning opportunities for everyone. We hope you like the class photos and content. We are so proud of our pupils and how mature and responsible they have become, learning within our curriculum and experiencing personal development opportunities like our residential, clubs and enrichment events such as Mental Health Week. Our staff continue to work hard to support progress in learning through our Knowledge Rich Curriculum. The content of lessons is well planned and specific so that pupils are exposed to engaging knowledge which grows overtime. In addition we teach pupils about diversity and skill development so that pupils experience a breadth of learning opportunities. Please use parents evening after half-term to ask questions about your child's progress in all areas. We hope to run more training sessions for families around our curriculum next term as these were popular and feedback was really positive!

We are taking part in Safer Internet Day on 8th February 2022. The theme 'All fun and games?' explores respect and relationships online. From gaming and chat, to streaming and video, young people are shaping the interactive entertainment spaces they are a part of. In school, each class will be covering age appropriate activities to explore how to keep themselves safe online. Keeping children safe online is a huge priority within the Norfolk Constabulary's Youth Engagement and Safer Schools Teams. The internet is an amazing tool, however, many of the issues the Police deal with when it comes to young people involve online behaviour. The recent Ofcom "Children and parents: media use and attitudes report" (2021) found that 97% of children aged 5 - 15 watch content on video sharing platforms. Only 30% of parents use controls to restrict their children's access to inappropriate content and just over half of 12-15s have had some form of negative online experience.

Norfolk Constabulary has some excellent resources to warn and inform families about online safety - there is also a template family internet agreement which helps lay down boundaries for home use. Our Learning

Year 3 – Oystercatcher

This half term has flown by in Oystercatchers! We can now all confidently recall our 3,4,6, and 8 times tables. We've mastered writing information texts and we have been working on our fitness and netball skills. In science, we've found it fascinating learning about rocks, fossils and soils and how they link together and we even had a go at making our own fossils. In history, we have enjoyed learning about the Picts, Scots, Anglo-saxons, Vikings and Normans and how waves of invasions shaped the UK we know today.



Year 4 - Avocet

Another great half-term Avocets! We have been investigating different states of matter in our Science unit. The children enjoyed observing how many gases were produced in various solids when adding water. Avocets have impressive artistic skills. They have created some wonderful collages with contrasting materials. In English, we have loved our last book 'Pirateology' by Dugald Steer. What a wonderful, brave pirate Arabella Drummond is!



Y34 STEM & Science Clubs

Our STEM and science club members have been working hard on building an electric car, learning to use the skills of accurate measurement and hand tools safely as part of their project. In science club we have carried out some explosive and at times quite smelly experiments investigating chemical reactions!

Y56 Singing Club

The first few weeks of our Singing Club has been great. We are learning the correct breathing technique and how to control our breath to sustain notes, we have sung in a round in 2 and 3 parts which can be difficult but was easily mastered! We have a dozen songs in our songbook including Adele, The Greatest Showman, Jessie J, Ariana Grande, Elton John to name a few and we will continue to add new songs after half-term. The children have even choreographed one of the songs!

Street Dance Club

Jess Stringer, a Dance Instructor from The Workshop in King's Lynn, has been teaching Street Dance this half-term which was fully funded by the school. She is really good and the children have enjoyed their sessions learning a few routines over the 5 weeks so we have decided to invite her back. This time we will subsidise the cost <u>but will charge parents £3 per week</u> (£15 to be paid up front via ParentPay).

Our Learning (cont'd)

<u>Year 5 – Albatross</u>

What a busy half-term in Albatross Class! We are really enjoying learning all about the French Revolution in history. We have learnt how Napoleon became the Emperor of France and tried to conquer Europe, until he met his match with British Admiral Nelson at the Battle of Trafalgar! In Geography, we've enjoyed learning about different regions of the UK including Yorkshire and Humberside; understanding that the UK has many contrasting areas with their own unique history. We've had great fun conducting some super science experiments in class including testing the density of different liquids – as you can from the picture! In amongst all of this we've learnt about the beautiful art of Chinese painting as well as getting a full understanding of the selfless and caring nature of Sikhism who strongly believe in equality and how above all else they believe in helping others before themselves which a lovely message for us all to learn from.



<u>Year 6 – Royal Tern</u>

At the end of the autumn half term we thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the Sainsbury Centre. The children learnt about the connections between art and climate change. They were also impeccably behaved which was commented on by many staff who work there! We have been going into more depths with decimals and percentages in Maths and also developed our speed and fluency with arithmetic this half term. It's also lovely to see many Year 6s coming to SATs drop-in on a Tuesday and Wednesday morning before school to work on their maths skills. In English, we have used the book Cogheart and are about to start Call of the Wild. The children produced amazing pieces of written work when we were writing a tale of fear. We have learnt about Nazi Germany and the lead up to World War Two in history and in science we have been learning about plants and have conducted a range of investigations to learn about all about them, including capillary action. Design and Technology lessons have been fantastic this half term. We have studied the Dyson company – did you know James Dyson comes from Cromer!? We became design engineers, and designed and built our own fan. The children were create at producing prototypes, which they had to keep adapting as challenges, and problems were found. In Science, we have been learning about plants and have conducted different investigations to learn about what plans need, capillary action and photosynthesis! A great half term year 6!

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

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PITTA PIZZAS

Ingredients

4large pitta breads
4 tbsp tomato purée
2 tsp mixed herb
2 tomatoes , sliced
6 slices salami , torn into small piece
50g cheddar , grated

Method

STEP 1

Heat the grill. Spread each pitta bread with 1 tbsp tomato purée, sprinkle over the mixed herbs, then lay on the tomato slices. Divide the salami between the pittas, sprinkle over the cheese and grill until the cheese is golden and bubbling.



BANANA PANCAKES

Ingredients

350g self-raising flour 1 tsp baking powder 2 very ripe bananas 2 medium eggs 1 tsp vanilla extract 250ml whole milk butter, for frying **To serve** 2 just ripe bananas, sliced maple syrup (optional) pecan halves, toasted and roughly chopped (optional)

Method

STEP 1

Sieve the flour, baking powder and a generous pinch of salt into a large bowl. In a separate mixing bowl, mash the very ripe bananas with a fork until smooth, then whisk in the eggs, vanilla extract and milk. Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients, tip in the wet ingredients and swiftly whisk together to create a smooth, silky batter.

STEP 2


Heat a little knob of butter in a large nonstick pan over a medium heat. Add 2-3 tbsp of the batter to the pan and cook for several minutes, or until small bubbles start appearing on the surface. Flip the pancake over and cook for 1-2 mins on the other side. Repeat with the remaining batter, keeping the pancakes warm in a low oven.

STEP 3

Stack the pancakes on plates and top with the banana slices, a glug of sticky maple syrup and a handful of pecan nuts, if you like.

1	I know that the Internet is an importa	int resource for my children and that being familiar be a wonderful place to visit, but I know that I must

3.	I will set reasonable rules and guidelines for computer use by my children, including how much time they may spend online. I will encourage them to participate in offline activities as well. We will discuss these rules and post them near the computer as a reminder.							
4.	I will not overreact if my child tells me about something "bad" she finds or does on the Internet							
5.	If my child does something that I do not approve of online we will have a calm conversation about my expectations and the reasons for our internet rules. I understand that just taking away the Internet will not solve the problem.							
6.	I will try and get to know my child's online friends and contacts just as I get to know his or her offline friends.							
7	I will put the home computer in a family area rather than in a private room (i.e. bedroom, office).							
8.	I will report suspicious and illegal activity and sites to the proper authorities and learn how to report abuse when necessary.							
9.	I will frequently check to see where my children have visited on the Internet and will talk to them if I see something I am concerned about or that I think is inappropriate.							
10.	I will talk to my children about their social networking profiles: what they can and cannot post, who they should allow as friends and how to behave appropriately in their online interactions.							
11.	I will learn about parental controls for filtering and blocking inappropriate Internet material from my children.							
12	If my child continues to break our Internet rules after we have discussed them I will impose penalties for their actions including taking away his or her computer, tablet, mobile phone or other devices until their behaviour changes.
