#### Dear Families,

We have enjoyed a busy start to the Summer Term with plenty of great learning taking place indoors and outdoors through our curriculum offer at school. Our pupils remain happy, energetic, well behaved and continue to learn well. Everyone has welcomed our new teaching assistant Harriette Pateman to our team who works with Year 4 to support learning in Avocet Class. Our Upper KS2 pupils have also just returned from an incredible residential experience at Kingswood, making the teachers very, very proud. Some of the activities they completed included, climbing wall, archery and den building. Some fantastic memories and experiences to cherish.

Our Y6 pupils have just completed the assessments set by the government in May called SATS - the staff and pupils worked so hard to undertake these tests and we are very proud of them all. They received their leaver's hoodies at the end of SATS week and they look fantastic! Other assessments taking place after half term are the Y4 Multiplication checks. Don't forget to practice at home over half term! You will receive reports at the end of this year with a summary of achievement in the statutory assessments in Y4 and Y6. Year 6 went along to the fire station in King's Lynn for Crucial Crew; a joint initiative between 3 rotary clubs at which primary school pupils learn about a wide range of health and safety topics. Across the school, pupils have participated in tournaments including tri-golf (hosted by the school) and cricket. Pupils continue to benefit from weekly swimming lessons too! Our local Co-op also visited the school to deliver an informative lesson to Y3 and Y5 on healthy living. The children were given some valuable advice on the importance of a balanced diet and making healthy choices.

#### **Our Learning**

#### <u>Year 3 – Oystercatcher</u>

This half term we have been exploring 'Light' in Science and have had great fun through investigation - refracting light through prisms to make rainbows, exploring reflection and looking at how we can change the size of shadows. In History we have been learning about the War of the Roses, developing our own opinion of what we think really happened to the two Princes in the Tower. Whilst our Geography topic has taken us to East Asia, learning all about the 'Land of the Rising Sun'. In English our class texts 'Dear Greenpeace' and 'There's a Rang-tan in my Bedroom' have not only developed the children's explanation text skills but inspired minds in helping the environment. Maths has seen Oystercatchers move on from fractions to time and as the sun is shining our Friday PE lessons involve developing and improving our tennis skills, whilst the children on Wednesday's are making a splash in the pool starting their first swimming lessons!



#### Year 4 – Avocet

Avocets have loved History and English this half term, learning about the Great Plague and the Great Fire of London. We have been investigating electrical circuits in Science and predicting which materials were conductors or insulators. In Art, we have made our own looms out of cardboard and weaved ribbons and wool into our designed tapestries. Next half term in Design and Technology, we are going to make our own night light using all our knowledge from Science about Electrical circuits. In Science, we are going to explore astronomy and the universe beyond earth.



#### <u>Year 5 – Albatross</u>

We have had a fabulous half-term in Albatross. We have worked really hard and learnt so much! In English we loved reading the book Floodland and used it to inspire some fabulous recount writing. We have been learning all about New Zealand in geography, including what the islands are like and some of traditions of the Maori people. Did you know that they greet each other by touching foreheads and noses together?! We studied the Industrial Revolution, learning all about the invention of steam power and Stephenson's Rocket – such an amazing invention that changed the world! Our PE lessons have focused on gymnastics and cricket, giving us all a chance to show off our amazing flexibility in gymnastics, and our throwing, catching, bowling and batting skills in cricket. Finally, we have been learning how to use and make cranks and cams so that we can make some moving toys in DT. We began by making some prototype toys and are very close to finishing the final versions. We will have a fantastic array of colourful moving animals to show off soon!



#### Our Learning (cont'd)

#### <u>Year 6 – Royal Tern</u>

Wow! What a half term! Royal terns have worked so hard during SATs week. They enjoyed wonderful breakfasts each morning which gave them the brain fuel to do the very best they could during the assessments. 'Funday Friday' was also a wonderful way to end the week. We have also enjoyed more fascinating units of work across the curriculum. In Art we have been studying the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood and recreated paintings such as 'Ophelia' and 'Light of the World.' This genre of painting was when art became 'HD' and we looked at the incredible detail of these works of art. In Geography we have studied Britain and discussed important issues such as climate change, air pollution and litter. We have become experts on the human body after looking at the different systems in Science such as our nervous system, circulatory system, muscular system and digestive system. Royal Terns have also developed an incredible understanding of the Cold War in history and we have linked this to the current situation in Ukraine. They have blown me away with their understanding of communism and capitalism and different elements that made up the Cold War; the arms race, proxy wars and space race. We also had a great trip to 'Crucial Crew' where we learnt how to keep ourselves safe. Finally, we have finished this half term with an amazing residential trip to Kingswood and those that didn't attend completed fun projects with Mrs Nurse – they built their own theatre and working puppets!



#### Drawing Club – Mrs Tilbrook

What a fantastic group of artists! Drawing club has had a great turn out and we have started this half term with a Posy drawing competition for the platinum Jubilee – 'A Posy Fit For The Queen'. I have added some of the children at work and what wonderful outcomes we have!



#### Cookery Club – Miss Roper

Oystercatchers can be seen below enjoying a healthy cookery club with Miss Roper. Fruit kebabs were on the menu, a good way to eat your five a day. The children chose the fruits they liked and also made some for their families, the end results looked very colourful and appetisiting. The children were a wonderful group to work with.



#### Singing Club – Mrs Bridge

We have grown in numbers this term and now cover all year groups! They are making a lovely sound and began this half-term with a performance in assembly – I was especially proud of the new members of the group who performed after only one rehearsal. We are working on a few new songs that we hope to perform to Parents on 26<sup>th</sup> May.

#### Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils - April to October 2022

Norfolk County Council has released details of its new Norfolk Cost of Living Support Scheme, to support families in need. This includes a monthly voucher award for children eligible for means-tested free school meals (FSM).

We have issued the FSM vouchers for April - August. Dates they can be redeemed are 20/5, 17/6, 15/7 and 12/8.

They are no longer linked to school holidays but being issued monthly. Parents can choose to save them up so they have more in the holidays if they wish but they must redeem them within the three month expiry date. If the vouchers expire they cannot be reissued.

There will be some more in September and October.

**Families in hardship and needing wider support** In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

#### Have your circumstances changed recently? You may be eligible for Free School Meals.





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#### **Traditional English Trifle**

#### Ingredients

To make the jelly, put the gelatine in a small bowl and cover with water. Leave to soak. Meanwhile, tip the sugar, lemon zest and juice and 400ml water into a pan and simmer, stirring occasionally, until the sugar has dissolved. Add the raspberries and bring to the boil. Reduce to a gentle simmer and cook for 5 mins, or until the raspberries have broken down. Pour the mixture through a sieve into a jug. Squeeze any excess water out of the gelatine and stir through the raspberry mixture. Pour into the base of a large trifle bowl and chill for at least 5 hrs, or overnight.

P 2 To make the custard, heat the milk in a pan with the vanilla pod until steaming, then remove from the heat and set aside. Whisk the sugar, comflour and egg yolks together in a bowl. Remove the vanilla and gradually pour the hot milk into the egg mixture, whisking constantly until well combined. Return to the pan and gently stir over a low heat until the custard has thickened. Stir in the clotted cream, pour into a bowl and cover the surface with a piece of baking parchment to prevent a skin forming. Leave to cool, then put in the fridge to chill until cold.

Put the frozen raspberries and jam in a small pan and cook for 5 mins until the raspberries have softened a little but are still holding their shape. Leave to cool. Whisk the cream with the icing sugar in a large bowl until it reaches a soft dropping consistency.

tep 4 Arrange the cake pieces over the set jelly. Crush most of the biscuits, reserving some whole, and scatter over the cake layer. Whisk the custard to loosen, then pour over the biscuit layer. Top with the raspberry compote, pushing the whole biscuits into it around the edges of the bowl. Spoon over the whipped cream, then decorate with the sprinkles and cherries, if you like. Will keep in the fridge for up to three days.
