


Newsletter ~ December 2019 Heacham Junior School





The carol service on Monday was a real success – it was wonderful to see so many people in the church to support the children and enjoy the Christmas poems and carols, which were read and sung so beautifully by the children.

The children continue to enjoy their learning across the curriculum and have been keen to share their new found knowledge with anyone who will listen. In history, the children in Year 3 have been studying Greek philosophy and Alexander the Great, they explored how his upbringing shaped the king he would become. The children also had the opportunity to debate whether they believed that he was a good or a bad ruler. In geography, the children in Year 4 have enjoyed learning about Mediteranean Europe, describing the physical and human features, as well as locating it on a map and describing the climate.

Year 5 pupils have been discovering how and why Islamic art and architecture relates to the religion of Islam in art and design. They have drawn and created a geometric design to create a pattern on a clay tile. Year 6 have been learning about the classification of living things in science. They have discovered the differences between animal and plant cells, labelling the various parts and functions. In English, the children have been enjoying developing their understanding of the'Talk for Writing' concept and how to internalise and innovate model texts. They have recently been editing and redrafting their final pieces with impressive results. The children have been focussing on multiplication and division in Year 3 and 4 – using and applying their mathematical understanding and learning from marvellous mistakes. In Year 5 and 6, the children have been exploring prime and square numbers, as well as consolidating their understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages.

Forest School

All the children enjoyed their Christmas forest school sessions with Emily. They followed some coordinates clues to find a variety of decorations in order to decorate their Christmas trees.

They sent photos of their trees to children in Africa to show that they are thinking about them at Christmas

time. They also had the opportunity to whittle some Christmas characters and loved roasting their Christmas marshmallows on the campfire too!







Sporting Events

Heacham Junior have competed in a wide range of sporting competitions this half term.

In the cluster swimming gala our pupils took home four silver and one gold medal!

Our cross country runners braved the rain and gave their best efforts at Snettisham. They brought home three gold medals, one silver and one bronze medal – with fourteen of our squad qualifying for the next round in January.
