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Our Learning

Year 3 - Oystercatcher

Year 3 have settled really well into their new school and have been working incredibly hard! We have been looking at place value and have moved onto addition and subtraction. We are continuing to work on our times tables and are very excited about challenging ourselves and each other on Time Tables Rockstar, as well as Tackling Tables. Any practice you can do at home will help the children enormously. We are working on 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10 tables. In English, we have written warning tales based on Icarus and are now working on persuasive texts. In history, we have been learning about the ancient Egyptians including the importance of the River Nile and being historians understanding hieroglyphics and artefacts. In geography, we have learnt all about compasses and grid reference. The children have also enjoyed starting their new learning in French, as well as creating their own rangoli patterns on the playground and baking some Hindu sweets to helps us understand Diwali.





Year 4 - Avocet

Avocets have had a great first half term. In Geography, we have been exploring our local area and developing our map skills such as finding the scale and working out the distance between two places. We have also learnt about light and dark Artwork. They have been drawing still life objects using the 'chiaroscuro' eyes technique to see shadows. We are just starting out final outcomes and carefully thinking about the order to paint the light and dark colours to create dramatic effect. The final picture shows the children acting out how Leon may have felt when leaving the place between in English. This was a great book to start this year with! Super efforts this term Avocets, keep it up! Looking forward to next term learning about Henry VIII and the Tudors in History and Mediterranean Europe in Geography- we even get to try some of their cuisine!







Our Learning (cont'd)

Year 5 – Albatross

We've had a very busy first half term in Albatross Class learning about some fascinating topics in all of our foundation subjects. In history we've been learning about the Islamic Golden Age and the creation of the progressive 'City of Peace' Baghdad in 972 CE where scholars would travel from all over the world to learn, study and share ideas. In RE the children now have a great understanding of the importance of Muhammad to Muslims and why the Muslim holy book, the Qur'an is so precious to all followers of Islam? These have linked perfectly with our art unit where we've learnt about the intricate nature of Islamic architecture. The children have designed and created their own clay tiles influenced by the geometric and vegetal patterns in the Islamic style we've been studying. We've also conducted some super science experiments in class measuring our lung capacity and making blood using marshmallows and cheerios to represent white blood cells and platelets! We have packed in so much this half term including learning to play the recorder and enjoying a fantastic day out at Holkham Hall where the children had the opportunity to listen to some fantastic performances by Classical Music Rocks. The children have consistently demonstrated excellent learning behaviors and we're so proud of them for all their hard work during this first half term. We can't wait to see what exciting things we'll get up to next half term!







Year 6 - Royal Tern

Year 6 have made a great start to the year. This half term in English we have been studying the book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan which is a beautiful and very moving book with no words. It follows the story of a man who is an immigrant and how he builds a new life for himself and his family. Royal Terns wrote amazing poetry using this book and our 'hot writes' were a meeting tale. ! In Art, we enjoyed learning about William Morris and 'decorative arts'. Children designed and printed their own wallpaper using reduction printing techniques. In History, we have been learning about World War One, the causes, how it was fought and the consequences of the war. They have learnt all about the periodic table in Science and conducted an experiment using an air freshener. PE has also been thoroughly enjoyable this half term; learning to play rounders and developing fitness in cross-country. We also got to go to the oldest theatre in the country – the Guildhall in King's Lynn – to watch a play! Our main focus for this term is to make sure all children know all of their times tables (please keep working on these on Times Table Rockstars and Tackling Tables) and also read as much as possible! Reading is so important, even just reading a few pages with an adult each day and answering a couple of questions will make such a difference!

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.





<u>Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – October 2022 to March 2023</u>

Support has been extended for the period 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers to the value of £15 per month per child with an additional £30 voucher in December. The Vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

Vegan Pumpkin Bread

Vegan pumpkin bread - this spiced pumpkin loaf cake tastes like autumn in cake form! This one-bowl pumpkin cake is soft, moist, spicy, easy to make, full of flavour and perfect for snacking on. Eggless and dairy-free.

Prep Time10 minutes, Cook Time1 hour 10 minutes Servings 8 people

Ingredients

- 280 g (2 1/4 cups) plain (all-purpose) flour
- 135 g (¾ cup) light brown soft sugar
- 100 g (½ cup) caster sugar
- 2 ¼ tsp baking powder
- ³/₄ tsp bicarbonate of soda (baking soda)
- 2 ½ tsp pumpkin spice/mixed spice (or use 1 tsp cinnamon, 1 tsp ginger, ¼ tsp nutmeg, 1/8 tsp allspice and 1/8 tsp cloves)
- ½ tsp salt
- 320 g (1 ⅓ cups) tinned pumpkin puree (NOT pumpkin pie filling) (see instructions above to make your own)
- 120 ml (½ cup) sunflower oil (or another flavorless oil)
- 100 ml (1/3 cup + 1 Tbsp + 1 tsp) unsweetened non-dairy milk (I used oat)
- 1 tsp cider vinegar/white wine vinegar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- a handful of pumpkin seeds to decorate (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/gas mark 4. Grease an approx 11.5 x 21.5 cm / 4.5 x 8.5 in loaf tin and line it with a strip of baking parchment that comes a little way above the sides so that you can easily lift the cake out once it is baked.
- 2. Whisk together the plain flour, light brown soft sugar, caster sugar, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, pumpkin spice and salt in a large mixing bowl.
- 3. Add the pumpkin puree, sunflower oil, non-dairy milk, vinegar and vanilla extract and whisk gently until no dry lumps remain but be careful not to over-mix.
- 4. Transfer the batter to the prepared loaf tin and spread it level. Scatter a handful of pumpkin seeds over the top then bake for 60-75 minutes until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean or with a few moist crumbs but no wet batter. Loosely cover the top with tin foil for the last 20 minutes of baking if it starts to get too dark.
- 5. Leave the cake to cool in the tin for 10 minutes then carefully lift it out onto a wire rack and leave to cool completely before slicing. Store leftovers in an airtight container for up to five days.






Black History Month
