Our Learning

Year 3 – Oystercatcher

This half term, we have been working hard in maths learning about mass and capacity and can now measure in grams, kilograms, millilitres, and litres. In English, we have been writing our own very exciting recount – imagining we are a water droplet on a journey of the water cycle. Oystercatchers have been able to apply their knowledge from both geography and science about the water cycle and rivers. In art, we have looked at mythological paintings; especially some of the Minotaurs Picasso was famous for painting. In geography, we have learnt about some of the major rivers in Europe and, in history, we have been learning about the crusades and the Magna Carta. Finally, in science, we have been learning about the importance of a healthy diet and how to keep our bodies healthy and in PE we have been improving our football skills. We have also had a lesson on British sign language and had great fun dressing up for Red Nose Day. Well done to all of Oystercatchers for working hard during assessment week and the spelling bee.



Year 4 – Avocet

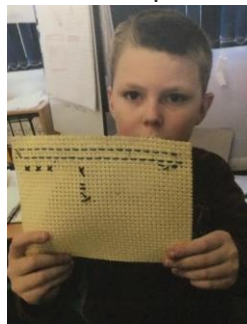
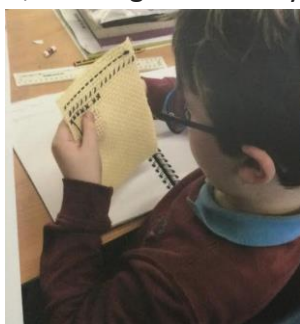
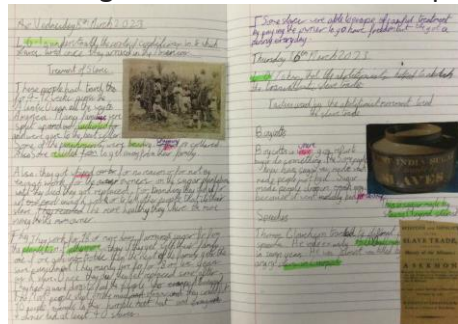
We have had an excellent half term in all subjects but the children have especially enjoyed our drama sessions with Ms Roberts on Tuesdays. In our Science lessons, we have been investigating about how sound is made. The children have been predicting and then observing what happens when you tap a drum with rice on top. Can the children remember if the vibrations were greater when tapping the drum lighter or harder? As a request from JLT, we have had a one-off sign language lesson this term that the children have loved. Next term, we are going to learn about 'James I and the gunpowder plot alongside Charles I and the civil war'. I know a few children have been looking forward to this unit all year. We also get to develop our sewing techniques too in Design & Technology! I would also like to congratulate the children through to Round 2 in the Spelling Bee. Well done!



Our Learning (cont'd)

Year 5 – Albatross

Our learning has again been so broad and engaging, with the children producing amazing amounts of work full of newfound knowledge. We've had a fascinating topic in History learning all about the African slave trade and the horrific atrocities and brutal treatment that many thousands had to endure during this terrible period in our history. We were relieved to learn that slavery was finally abolished in 1833 with the help of many devoted campaigners, most prominently Thomas Clarkson who was the driving force behind ending the Transatlantic slave trade. Why don't you ask your child to describe some of the conditions and punishments that so many slaves were subjected to? In Geography, we've expanded our knowledge about the natural biomes in Australia and how very different and vast the landscape is, whilst in RE we've been trying to find evidence from the Bible that Jesus was aware of God's plan for him – some very deep and thought-provoking questions for us all to ponder. As with last term, we've again conducted some super science experiments in class to test forces. The children were tasked to design their own ways to prove that forces exist. We had parachutes to show the effects of air resistance as well as a visit from the 'Mad Science' team who tasked us with creating our own rockets, testing the effects of thrust – we can confirm we definitely have some super scientists among us! In PE, we've been enjoying creating our own dances using the 'Dance by Chance' method and we've also been improving our netball skills. Finally, in Art the children have been creating their own Victorian samplers, learning some tricky stitches but producing some wonderful designs.



Year 6 – Royal Tern

Year 6 have been working incredibly hard this half term – we are so proud of them! Their March assessments showed fantastic progress, which was well deserved. We have enjoyed learning about World War Two and Nazi Germany – we looked at the role of Bletchley Park and the Holocaust. Year 6 are very good at deep and thoughtful conversations about important issues. In Science, we have been learning about light and electricity. They enjoyed conducting an experiment about what happens to shadows when you move a light source. In Geography, we have been learning about Africa and studying issues such as desertification. We are learning about transport in French – ask us to list different transport in French and see if we can teach you some new vocabulary! In English, we have been using the moving picture book 'Rose Blanche' which links to our history learning; we have used it to write cumulative diaries. In Maths, we have been learning about shape, angles and statistics as well as continuing to develop our speed and accuracy with arithmetic. We are very excited about our Duxford trip right at the end of this term. Also, how can we forget when it snowed and we all ran out to play!

The Government strives for **every pupil to achieve 97% attendance**. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

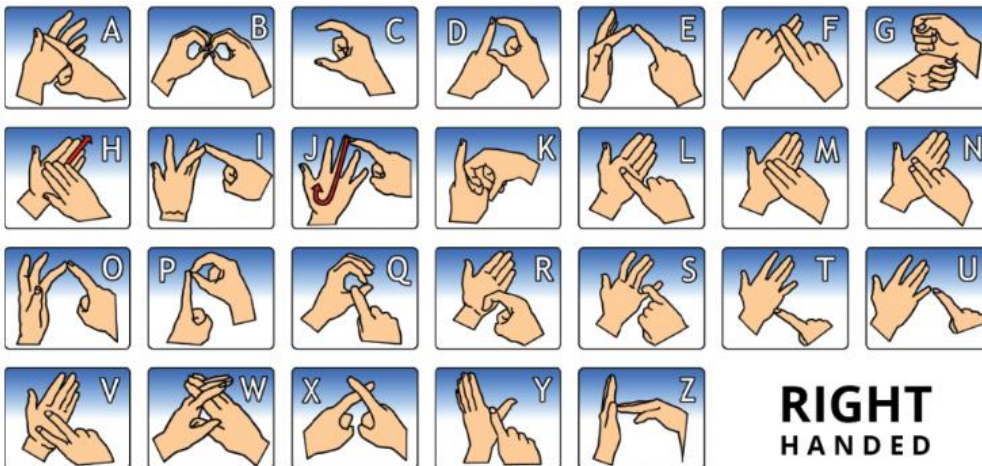

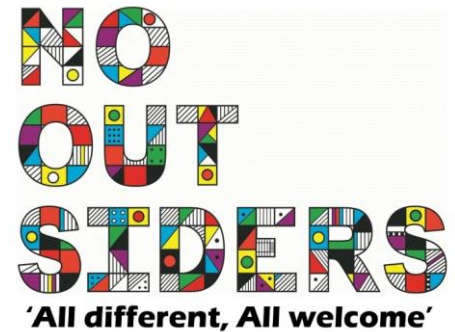

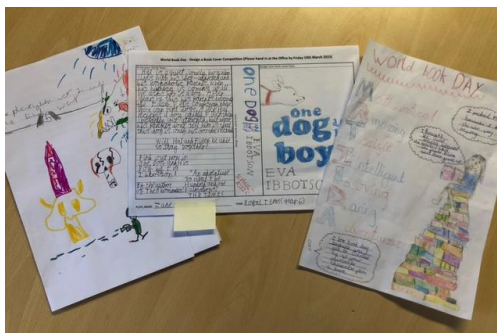

Reading

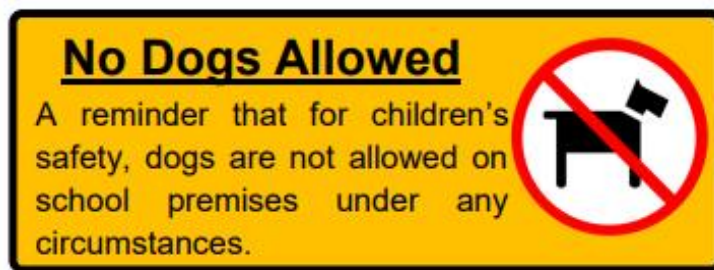

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The Vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

Hot Cross Buns

Ingredients

For the buns

500g strong white bread flour

½ tsp salt

2 heaped tsp mixed spice

50g caster sugar

50g butter, chopped into cubes

200g mixed dried fruit

7g sachet easy-blend dried yeast

200ml milk

2 eggs

For the crosses & glaze

3 tbsp plain flour

honey or golden syrup, for brushing

Method

- Step 1** Tip the flour into a bowl and stir in the salt, mixed spice and sugar.
- Step 2** Rub in the butter with your fingertips. Stir in the dried fruit, then sprinkle over the yeast and stir in. Gently warm the milk so it is hot, but still cool enough to put your finger in for a couple of seconds. Beat with the eggs, then pour into the dried ingredients
- Step 3** Using a blunt knife, mix the ingredients to a moist dough, then leave to soak for 5 mins. Take out of the bowl and cut the dough into 8 equal pieces.
- Step 4** Shape the dough into buns on a floured surface. Space apart on baking sheet, cover loosely with cling film, then leave in a warm place until half again in size. This will take 45 mins-1 hr 15 mins, depending on how warm the room is.
- Step 5** When the buns are risen, heat oven to 220C/fan 200C/gas 7. Mix the flour with 2 tbsp water to make a paste. Pour into a plastic food bag and make a nick in one of the corners. Pipe crosses on top of each bun.
- Step 6** Bake for 12-15 mins until risen and golden. Trim the excess cross mixture from the buns, then brush all over with honey or golden syrup. The buns will keep fresh for a day. After that they are best toasted and served with butter.

Happy Baking!
