Our Learning

<u>Year 3 – Oystercatcher</u>

This half term we have been exploring 'Light' in Science and have had great fun through investigation - exploring reflection and looking at how we can change the size of shadows. In history, we have been learning about the War of the Roses, through role-play, hot seating and debates developing our own opinion of what we think happened to the two Princes in the Tower. Whilst our geography topic has taken us to East Asia, learning all about the 'Land of the Rising Sun', Japan. In English, our class texts 'Dear Greenpeace' and 'There's a Rang-tan in my Bedroom' have not only developed the children's explanation text skills but inspired minds in helping the environment. Maths has seen Oystercatchers move on from fractions to time and in PE, the children have been making a splash in the pool starting their first swimming lessons!









Year 4 - Avocet

Avocets have loved English this half term, learning about the Great Plague. We have been investigating electrical circuits in Science and predicting which materials were conductors or insulators. In Art, we have made our own looms out of cardboard and weaved ribbons and wool into our designed tapestries. To end this half term we went to Norwich Castle Museum and experienced a day as Romans and Iceni. Being able to see real Torcs that have been found in Snettisham, making their own torcs and taking part in Roman shield formations. Next half term in Design and Technology, we are going to make our own night light using all our knowledge from Science about Electrical circuits. In Science, we are going to explore astronomy and universe beyond earth.









Our Learning (cont'd)

Year 5 – Albatross

We have had a marvellous half term in Albatross! It has been non-stop learning and the content covered the children have really engaged with. In English, we loved reading the book 'Floodland' and used it to inspire some fabulous recount writing. We have been learning all about New Zealand in geography, including, what the islands are like and some of traditions of the Maori people. Did you know that they greet each other by touching foreheads and noses together? We studied the Industrial Revolution, learning all about the invention of steam power and Stephenson's Rocket – such an amazing invention that changed the world! Our PE lessons have focused on gymnastics and cricket, giving us all a chance to show off our amazing flexibility in gymnastics, and our throwing, catching, bowling and batting skills in cricket. In computing, the children have had the chance to enhance their programming and circuit skills by building a Crumble Controller into a circuit. They have learnt how to write algorithms on a computer and then upload their inputs onto the Crumble device, then using a variety of outputs (motor, sparkle LED etc.) to test their input/s (algorithms).











Year 6 - Royal Tern

Wow! What a half term! Royal terns have worked so hard during SATs week. It was great to see so many in Rise and Shine Breakfast Club for pain au chocolat, toast and bacon sandwiches! We are so proud of them for the hard work they put in! It was lovely to finish the week with a big coronation celebration lunch! The following week our leavers' hoodies arrived – the children look great in them! We have also enjoyed more fascinating units of work across the curriculum. In Art we have been studying the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood and recreated paintings such as 'Ophelia' and 'Light of the World.' In Geography, we have studied Britain and discussed important issues such as climate change, air pollution and litter. We have become experts on the human body after looking at the different systems in Science such as our nervous system, circulatory system, muscular system and digestive system. Royal Terns have also developed an incredible understanding of the Cold War in history – their knowledge and ability to explain events during this period of history is amazing! We also had a great trip to 'Crucial Crew' where we learnt how to keep ourselves safe. We finished this half term with an art-based trip to the Sainsbury.









Year 6 - Well done

There is so much to celebrate for our Year 6 this half term. They worked hard for their SATS - most attended some of our morning Booster Drop-In Sessions, some attended all of them! Ms Prosser cooked up a storm with breakfasts each morning before the exams; toast, croissant, crumpets, fresh fruit and even a bacon sarnie on the last day!

They had treats at the end of the tests each day as a reward for their hard work and commitment to their learning all year – they really have worked hard this year, well done year 6!

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for **every pupil to achieve 97% attendance**. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The Vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

<u>Have your circumstances changed recently?</u> You may be eligible for Free School Meals.
