


Newsletter ~ February 2020 Heacham Junior School





Our history curriculum timeline wrap was recently installed along the Year 4/5 corridoor. It looks fantastic and everyone is in awe of it. If you get an opportunity come in and take a look for yourself – you won't be disappointed.

With the taster session held by Lunchtime Co, drop-in mornings and our open afternoon, this half term has been a busy one.

In Sanderlings the children have been creating seascapes in Art in the style of Constable using a range of brushstroke techniques. In Geography, they have been learning about different settlements — comparing rural, urban and suburban areas.





Avocet Class have explored solids, liquids and gases in Science. They carried out an experment using chocolate to help better understand changing states of matter. In History, pupils have studied the Gunpowder Plot which was led by Robert Catesby in an effort to overthrow the king end the persecution of Roman Catholics by the English government. Pupils have enjoyed using drama to really bring the story to life!





Albatross Class have used choreography to complete sequences of steps to perform a dance. This has included working in unison, using a variety of motifs and moving in different directions or pathways.





In Geography, the children have learnt about the different countries that make up Eastern Europe, as well as the four seas that surround it. They enjoyed learning about the two major cities of Russia, Moscow and St Petersburg, which included comparing the human and physical features of each.





Oystercatchers have been learning about the French Revolution in History, finding out about how unequal the lives of the rich and poor were and exploring how it all began with the storming of the Bastille. In Music, pupils have been performing musical pieces with an awareness of their individual roles, using instruments alongside a simple graphic score.





Among other subjects, Royal Terns have been finding out what plants need to survive in Science, describing what happens when its requirements are restricted. In History, they have been learning about the rise of Hitler, including how he became the leader of the Nazi Party after World War I. Pupils went on to learn about Germany's invasion of Poland in 1939 and how this led to World War II.

Curriculum Open Afternoon

On 5th February we held an open afternoon so that we could share our new knowledge curriculum with our families. Parents and pupils enjoyed an afternoon of lessons including Science, Geography and History across the school.

It was wonderful to see so many people in school who were keen to share in their children's education, learning alongside them and offering gentle encouragement.





We continue to run drop in sessions in all classes on Wednesday mornings from 8.30 - 8.40am. Come along and join in with some mathematics and reading activities. All welcome!


Pick up
