Dear Families,

The pupils have made a great start to this year and we are very proud of them. Term has flown past with plenty of opportunities already undertaken at school to promote learning, behaviour and personal development. We were so impressed with the number of pupils who applied to take on additional roles and responsibilities in September – helping to keep up the grounds, being eco friendly, promoting reading, supporting emotional wellbeing of peers – the list goes on! Your contributions at home have made a tremendous difference and we thank you for your help. Promoting good reading habits, using times tables rock stars, setting a daily routine for homework, maintaining good attendance really benefit your children and increases their resilience. This enables them to feel confident which helps promote happiness. So important!

Furthermore, in 2023 our pupils attained some great results in national assessments. In May, pupils across the nation sit Y6 tests called SATS. We are delighted that at Heacham Junior School, our pupils' attained excellent results with 70% achieving the reading, writing and mathematics standard across subjects. This is 11% above the 2023 national average, which was only 59%. In addition, in Y4, our pupils completed the national multiplication test. Results in this test were also significantly above national outcomes by nearly 20%. This means pupils leave our school well prepared for High School and ready for their next steps in life. We aim to sustain these good outcomes and pupil attitudes in future years.

All of us have times when we struggle- as children and as an adult. Therefore, support for learning and wellbeing is also very important to us – we have dedicated pastoral care, forest School sessions, trained assistants and a SEND team that can help you. Please contact us if you have any concerns. We will send a parental questionnaire to you after half term and encourage you to complete it so we can learn about your views and build on these.

Finally - Good news as Ellie Jones has welcomed a beautiful baby boy called Charlie born last week. We send her family all our love and best wishes.

Our Learning

Year 3 – Oystercatcher

Year 3 have settled well into their new school and have been working incredibly hard! We have been looking at place value and have moved onto addition and subtraction. We are continuing to work on our times tables - any practice you can do at home will help the children enormously. In English, we have written warning tales based on Icarus and are now working on persuasive texts. Whilst in history, we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians including the importance of the River Nile and being historians understanding hieroglyphics and artefacts. In geography, we have learnt all about special sense including reading compasses and grid reference, which links to our PE topic OAA. The children have also enjoyed starting their new learning in French, as well as creating their own rangoli patterns and baking some Hindu sweets to helps us understand Diwali.

Year 4 - Avocet

Avocets have had a fantastic and settled first half term. In Geography, we have been exploring our local area and developing our map skills such as finding the scale and working out the distance between two places. We also compared modern maps and historic maps; discussing changes we can see. In Art we have been learning about light and dark. We have been drawing still life objects using the 'chiaroscuro' eyes technique to see shadows. We have mixed colours and thought about adding tint, shade and shadow to make our paintings look like real life photographs. Well done for a great start to the year Avocets, keep it up! Looking forward to next term learning about Henry VIII and the Tudors in History and Mediterranean Europe in Geography- we even get to try some of their cuisine!


The next meeting will be in the school hall on Tuesday 31st October at 2.45-3.25pm. Please do come along for a taster.



Our Learning (cont'd)

Year 5 - Albatross

We have had a very busy first half term in Albatross Class learning about some fascinating topics in all of our foundation subjects. In history, we have been learning about the Islamic Golden Age and the creation of the progressive 'City of Peace' Baghdad in 972 CE where scholars would travel from all over the world to learn study and share ideas before being destroyed by the Mongols in 1258. In RE the children now have a great understanding of the importance of Muhammad to Muslims and why the Muslim holy book, the Qur'an is so precious to all followers of Islam. These have linked perfectly with our art unit where we have learnt about the intricate nature of Islamic architecture. The children have designed and created their own clay tiles influenced by the geometric and vegetal patterns in the Islamic style we have been studying. We have completed an exciting class book called 'Wolf Brothe'r where a young boy (Torak) befriends a wolf, forming an unbreakable bond on their quest to find the Mountain of the World Spirit. The children have consistently demonstrated excellent learning behaviors and presentation across the entire curriculum. We are so proud of them for all their hard work during this first half term. We cannot wait to see what exciting things we will get up to next half term!









Year 6 - Royal Tern

Year 6 have made a great start to the year. This half term in English we have been studying the book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan which is a beautiful and very moving book with no words. It follows the story of a man who is an immigrant and how he builds a new life for himself and his family! In Art, we enjoyed learning about William Morris and 'decorative arts'. Children designed and printed their own wallpaper using reduction printing techniques. In History, we have been learning about World War One, the causes, how it was fought and the consequences of the war. They have learnt all about the periodic table in Science and conducted an experiment using an air freshener! We have also been taking part in the Positive Footprints scheme where we have been learning about our own qualities, skills and talents and how these could be transferable in our future career aspirations. It has been great to not only see them identify their own qualities and skills but also the qualities their friends have.

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for **every pupil to achieve 97% attendance**. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The Vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.
