Our Learning

Year 3 – Lapwing & Oystercatcher

Wow! It was a short half term but we certainly have done the work to make up for it!! This half term Oystercatcher Class and Lapwing Class have been on another river experience in Ely. We got to go river dipping and we even had a trip on a boat. It was amazing!! As well as this we have learnt all about light and optics, architecture, Sikhism, Romans and Britons, sequencing and sounds, Japan and the War of the Roses. We have been practicing our swimming in PE and we even got to have a whole morning on the climbing wall! We cannot believe we are already getting ready for a fantastic Summer 2. Year 4 – Avocet

This half-term, Avocets have had a fantastic time diving into our learning! In History, we've been fascinated by The Gunpowder Plot, and in Science, we've been sparking our curiosity with circuits and electricity. Maths has boosted our confidence in solving time-related problems, while in English, we've started exploring the Plague—something we'll be delving into even more in Summer 2. In Art, we've become skilled weavers, and in Latin, we have explored both British and Latin myths. Our Spelling Bee is well underway, and in RE we've been exploring Humanism for the very first time! In addition, we've been burning off plenty of energy in PE with an action-packed game of DODGEBALL! Alongside, investigating how we can keep our body and mind healthy with help from Lynnsport. Finally, we capped off yet another wonderful half-term by visiting Norwich Castle to see just what it was like to live like a Roman. It's been a brilliant half term for Avocets, and we can't wait to see what's in store next!



Year 5 – Albatross

What a fantastic summer 1 in Albatross Class! The children have worked hard in all areas of the curriculum. They have produced some amazing moving toys in their DT projects. They were very proud of their hot writes where they wrote a diary entry describing their escape from the flooded 'Eels Island'. After learning about Australia, we have learnt all about the island of New Zealand including its rare species of bird, the All Blacks and the Maori. We have been learning all about the industrial revolution during the Victorian age in our history lessons. This included children's jobs, the steam engine and what it was like living and working in the cities and factories. Linking with this topic, we had the opportunity to visit Gressenhall on a 'Victorian Day'. The children took part in farm work, trying drop scones and experiencing a Victorian classroom. Gamechangers visited year 5 where we learnt about teamwork, inclusion and resilience. They all enjoyed taking part in the activities and worked hard to incorporate those values. All together a busy and exciting term. Well done!



Year 6 – Royal Tern

This term has been a very busy and important one for our year sixes. They can all be extremely proud of themselves for the effort they applied in the lead-up to and the completion of the SATs. They really have worked their socks off! In our wider curriculum we have enjoyed looking at the Cold War - including the space race and the arms race between the USA and the USSR. In art, we have been studying the pre-Raphaelite brotherhood and creating drawings based on nature influenced by these artists. In Geography, we have tackled UK issues such as flooding and waste. In Science, we have studied the human body this half-term. As you can see in the pictures, we have used iPads to complete exciting and competitive retrieval quizzes based on the curriculum. The pupils continue to impress with the way they apply themselves and represent the school values each day.

Families in hardship and needing wider support in addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support.

Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide financial support, including essential household items, to families experiencing hardship. Wider support from a range of partners can then also be made available with NAS working alongside the Children's Services Community and Partnerships service.

Families may get in touch with NAS via their dedicated website, which includes an online application form at <https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/article/41957/What-the-Client-Hardship-Service-is>, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – EXTENDED

Norfolk County Council is extending the scheme to **March 2026**. This is reflective of the recent government announcement. This is for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for FSM will receive Edenred vouchers for this period. The Vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets. They cannot be re-issued if they expire.

Have your circumstances changed recently? You may be eligible for Free School Meals.

The school receives funding for each child who comes under Pupil Premium (including free school meals), so it is worth applying even if you don't have school meals!! You can apply online

PUNCTUALITY MATTERS!

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

19 days lost a year through being late means 90% attendance.

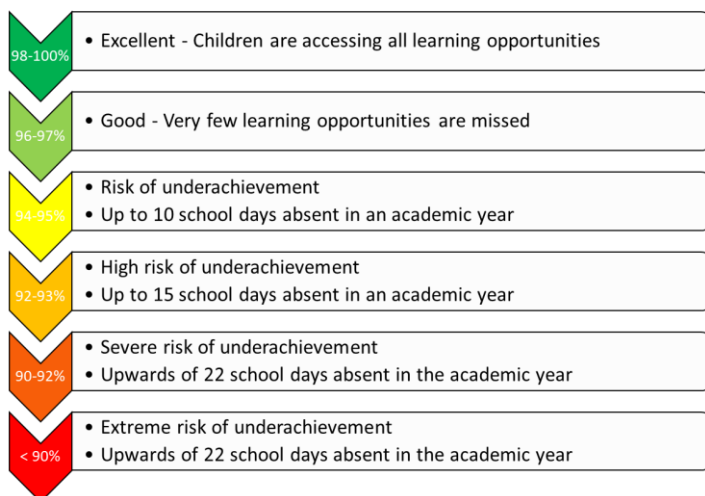

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for **every pupil to achieve 97% attendance**. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.



Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – October 2022 to March 2023

Support was extended for the period 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM).
