OUR LEARNING

Year 3/4 Oystercatcher

Oystercatchers have had an exciting and creative half term! We loved making our own pencil cases, letting our imaginations run wild with designs and colours. In Science, we explored sound and learned all about how we hear – the children were fascinated by the different noises around us. World Book Day was magical as we created our own versions of The Magic Faraway Tree, sharing wonderful stories and ideas. In Geography, we discovered London, its famous landmarks, and the importance of tourism. Our learning was topped off with a fantastic trip to the Sainsbury Centre, where we explored art and culture in an inspiring setting.



Year 4 – Avocet

In History, we explored the fascinating world of the Maya civilization, learning about where the Maya lived, how their cities were organised and what daily life was like. Pupils discovered the importance of temples, rulers and some of the achievements of the Maya, including their number system and calendar. In Geography, we focused on London and the South East, locating the region on a map and learning about its key physical and human features. The children explored major landmarks, rivers and how London has developed into the busy capital city it is today. In Science, our topic was sound. Pupils investigated how sounds are made through vibrations, how sound travels and how we hear. They also explored how pitch and volume can change and carried out simple investigations to deepen their understanding. In Art and Design Technology, the children designed and created their own pencil cases. They practiced measuring, cutting and joining materials carefully while thinking creatively about patterns, colours and practical design. Finally, in English, Year 4 studied the powerful story *The Boy at the Back of the Class*. Inspired by the themes and events of the book, the children wrote their own newspaper reports, focusing on clear structure, formal language and reporting key events in an engaging way. It has been another busy and exciting term, and the children have shown great enthusiasm and effort in all areas of their learning. We are very proud of their progress!

Year 5 – Albatross

This has been such a crazy jam packed half term! Our crowning moment was during the Music Festival we took part in. We were told in our feedback that you could tell what a team we are and we took great pride in that. We have had some fascinating topics this half-term. Learning about the abolition of slavery really opened our eyes to the difficulties experienced by those in the past. In science, the children developed a greater understanding of the forces found around them and developed their scientific enquiry skills. The sewing skills across the class have blown me away and we have built our skills over a range of stitches. In PE, we have certainly pushed our flexibility. We have created symmetrical and asymmetrical balances and learnt how to sequence different rolls. At Smithdon, we had a fun packed day developing our drama, IT and science skills. We had incredible compliments about our behaviour, definitely something to be very proud of. Thank you so much for all the hard effort and the commitment from parents at home.



Year 6 – Royal Tern

This was a short, yet jam-packed half term in Year 6, which included a trip to the Imperial War Museum, Duxford and a visit from the King's Lynn Guildhall to deliver a Shakespeare workshop, based on the story of Macbeth. Both these immersive experiences were on top of all the work we have been doing in each subject area this half term. This has included learning about Anne Frank's diary in English – which couples with our History learning on World War 2 and the Holocaust. A difficult subject but one which the pupils have really focused and engaged with. In Science, we have explored how light works – in relation to how we see and the different parts of our eye. We have also conducted investigations with electricity. In Geography, we have studied the continent of Africa, meanwhile in PE, we have been outside enjoying hockey. In PSHE, we have been learning about making healthy choices. Not only this, we have had visits from 'Mind and Mood' group and the Mental Health support team to aid our pupils in the changes coming this year. It's been a very busy half-term as you can tell, so we'd advise pupils to rest up and enjoy the Easter break! Remember to spend some time preparing for SATs and we look forward to welcoming everyone back after the holidays.

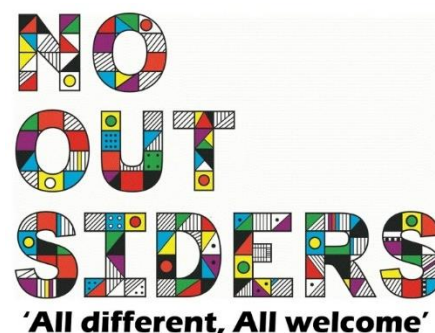
