Our Learning

Sanderlings

In maths, we have been exploring mass and capacity. We have had great fun measuring different objects and liquids and really enjoyed adding different volumes of liquid to create mysterious colour changing medicines, inspired by Roald Dahl's 'George's Marvellous Medicine.' In science we have been exploring magical magnets, testing different items to see which are magnetic and even created our own compass! We have loved learning about Henry VIII and his dynasty in history and we were all shocked at how he treated his wives!











Avocets

Avocets have had an amazing last half term. We have enjoyed making circuits to create torches which has progressed into designing and making nightlights. They have shown their amazing knowledge learnt from science last half term to help them in the design and technology unit. What can I say about their enthusiasm towards astronomy in science? Super attitude! They have been over and above learners and some of the children have created space posters at home as well. This half term has been lovely as we have been able to teach music as a class and sing (quietly in class) the song 'Blackbird' by the Beatles and the children can't seem to get the song out of their minds. I wish you all the best in Year 5!







Lapwings

In science, we have been learning about meteorology — which included thunderstorms, hurricanes, tornadoes and different types of wind. We made anemometers and used them outside to measure the wind speed. We have been screen printing in Art; creating our own designs, templates and actual screen prints. We also looked at various artists including Warhol and Hokusai. We've studied the local area in geography, looking at the different uses of land, buildings and house prices. We carried out field work on a recent walk around Heacham and used this data collected to create bar graphs, pie charts on desktop field work. In maths we have looked into metric and imperial measurements. We used the idea from 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl and created our own medicines by carefully measuring out different ingredients and seeing what the total volume was and what colour they turned. In history, we have been studying the Victorian Age. We have focused on social reform and Queen Victoria's legacy and compared it to that of her predecessors. We have been learning about commitment in RE and how this is shown in the Christian religion. In french, we have focused on naming the different rooms of a house and describing them in relation to their colour or what activity you may do there. In PSHE, we have focused on changes in relation to our bodies, puberty and how a baby is made.











Our Learning (cont'd)

Albatross

Wow! What a busy term we've had. The children were particularly excited to be able to leave school and go on a local field trip around Heacham as part of geography. We gathered lots of data about local businesses, land use, population and leisure. They discovered so many amenities on our doorstep - Heacham has lots to offer. In science we've learnt about meteorology and found out some fascinating weather facts. We've made our own anemometer to measure wind speed. Why not ask your child if they can explain the difference between a tornado and a hurricane? In PE we've been making the most of being outside and have been working on athletics — we've seen some great distances jumped and super javelin throws. In PSHE we have covered a lot in our 'Changing Me' topic, discussing self-image and self-esteem and the changes we all experience as we grow up and enter puberty. We have taken part in a fascinating finance workshop, charity Fun Run for the QEH and our bubble sports day. We'll miss them as they move into year 6 or onto high school. They will all be amazing in their future journeys!









Oystercatchers

Oystercatchers have been working incredibly hard this half-term with assessments and units of work sent from high schools to help with the transition to high school. Finally, we have conquered long division! Our English transition unit has looked at myths and legends and how story-telling has evolved over time and is linked to landscape and culture. Our foundation subjects have also been very interesting: in history we have studied the development of the civil rights movement, geography we have studied the global issues such as the impact of tourism on the environment and the children wrote passionately about stopping plastic pollution. In art we have been building bird feeders and for some children it's been the first time they have used saws and glue guns! We have some lovely activities lined up for the last three days of term for our hard-working leavers. We will celebrate and have fun but it will be tinged with sadness as we say goodbye to them all and wish them every success for the future.

Music Tuition with Miss Berners





Year 4 String players have been getting to grips with their Violins and Cellos this term. They have been learning to pluck the strings, play with the bow, use their fingers to make different notes, and read music notation.

Year 5 Brass players have been learning trumpets & trombones this term, using mainly plastic type instruments making them easier to hold. They are learning how to adjust the shape of their mouths to produce different notes, use positions on the trombone slide, use valve combinations on the trumpets, and read music notation.

Sadly, the proposed concert involving all the musicians in the Trust's schools, has had to be postponed until October.





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
